

Giuseppe Barbato, M.D., Ph.D., Psychiatrist, is full time associate professor at the Second University of Naples. He received his M.D. degree from the University Federico II in Naples (1983). Following two stays as guest researcher in 1985 and in 1989, he has worked as a post-doc fellow (1990-1992) at the National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH). He has been involved in research addressing the role of photoperiod in regulating human psychophysiological systems and on REM sleep regulation. He has participated to studies on adverse reactions to psychotropic drugs, sponsored by the National Research Council (CNR) (1984-1986) and by the Italian Institute of Health (1998-2000). He has served as ad hoc referee for the following journals: Journal of Neurophysiology, Journal of Applied Physiology, Biological Psychiatry, Perceptual and motor skills, Psychological Reports, Sleep, Journal of Affective Disorders, Journal of Sleep Research, Neuroscience Letters, Psychiatry Research. Journal of American Genetics, Clinical Endocrinology, Hormone and Metabolic Research. His recent work is mainly devoted to sleep deprivation and sleep wake-manipulation, analysis of the dopaminergic system in different psychiatric illnesses and condition throughout measurement of peripheral blink rate, and to the effects of light on arousal and performance. With Norman Rosenthal, and Giacomo Bonaveglia he has published the book "Le stagioni e la mente"(2002) (Editore Longanesi).

Giuseppe Barbato si è laureato in Medicina alla Università Federico II di Napoli nel 1983. Dopo la specializzazione in Psichiatria conseguita con lode nel 1987, nel 1991 ha conseguito il titolo di Dottore di Ricerca. E' responsabile del Servizio di Psicofisiologia Clinica del Dipartimento di Psicologia.
